# History of 201 S. Walnut St.

## YSCF has officially taken up residence at 201 S. Walnut Street!

Some know the building as the old library, the school district offices, or simply the "rock house". Beginning in April 2024, YSCF calls it home! The building has been lovingly renovated thanks to the Village of Yellow Springs and an incredibly talented and dedicated work crew. We envision this space as one that will be utilized by the Foundation and our community for many years to come.



The building opened as the Yellow Springs Library in 1935 after being built by the Village as a Works Progress Administration (WPA) project. The land was purchased from the Presbyterian church for \$500 by the Library Association, the funding of which came from the proceeds of many bake sales and 25 cents per ticket sales for a variety of Shakespeare plays. The stone was donated by Antioch College and came from the Glen Helen quarry.



At the dedication of the library in 1935, a presentation speech was given by R.B. Stewart, the father of Perry Stewart, one of YSCF's founders. The library eventually moved out citing a need for more space, and in 1964 the Yellow Springs School Board moved in. The school board held their offices here until 2022 and the building has been vacant since.

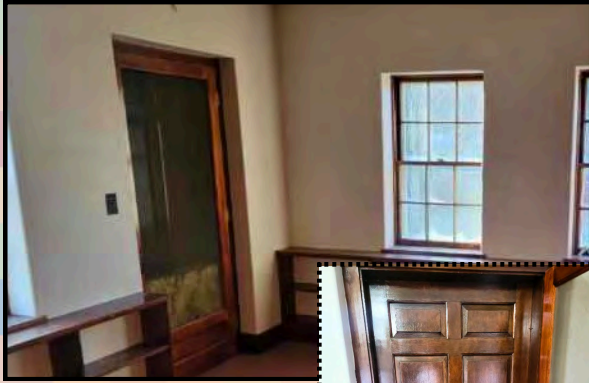

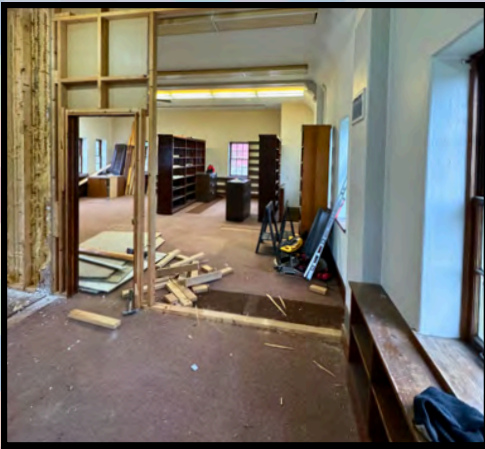

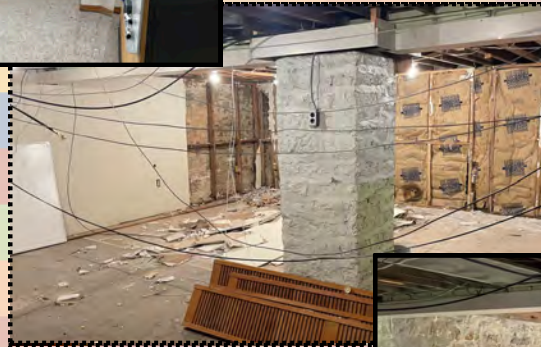
